Meeting was held on August 13, 2013.

Several changes were made to the budget: AA District Pledge increased to \$9,200, scholarships to \$500, newsletter printing to \$300, UMYF missions to \$200, Contingency Fund to \$200. Children's Missions were added

at \$100 as well as Memorial Receptions/Supplies at \$100. VBC Luncheon reduced to \$250. Budget will be voted on at the September potluck.

With the numerous news stories of unresolved medical issues and high suicide rates for our veterans, I think we can all agree that many who

serve in our military are not being treated justly by our society when they return home.

This month, we will have the opportunity to hear an extraordinary speaker with first-hand experiences in these matters: Logan Mehl-Laituri. He is the coauthor of *Reborn on the Fourth of July* and will give a message in worship on September 22.

Logan Mehl-Laituri spent over six years in the United States Army, including a 14-month deployment to Iraq as a forward observer for the field artillery. In 2006, he was honorably discharged after applying to be recognized as a noncombatant conscientious objector in order to return to combat without a firearm as a Christian pacifist.


Reborn on the Fourth of July; The Challenge of Faith, Patriotism, & Conscience is the story of what God did in his life in the midst of combat deployments and the peacemaking call of Jesus. Logan says "I LOVE sparking and maintaining meaningful conversations at the intersection of faith and service."

Pastor Bob is also leading a conversation about Just War and Christian Pacifism with a preview of Logan's book on Sunday, September 15, at 10:45-11:45 am in the Wesley Lounge. All are welcome.

## Food for the Soul

This summer I participated in the small women's group that discussed the book, "A Faithful Heart" by Sally Dyck, led by our own Nancy Lynn. The gathering, sharing and caring of the 20+ women was a rich feast for our souls. I'd like to share some of the writings and thoughts from this time.

God said, "I am holy; you be holy." (I Peter 1:15)

"It's sometimes difficult to think of each day as holy, when days are filled with checking off the todo list, isn't it? Eugene Peterson's paraphrase of Romans 12, "Take your everyday, ordinary life – your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life – and place it before God as an offering." Our everyday, ordinary lives are offerings to God.

If we think of our days as being divinely guided, or full of "providence," this changes our perspective on the to-do list. Folding the laundry can become a blessing to your family, shaking someone's hand could be the physical touch that person needs to feel connected to something

greater, a quiet moment can be the stillness that reminds you of the constant presence of God. <u>Our everyday</u>, ordinary lives are holy offerings to God.

When we think about being "more holy" or practicing the presence of God in our lives, we can easily make the mistake of thinking that we have to add things into our lives. But being open to the presence of God in our lives simply means that we are awake and alive to God in all the people and activities around us. If we are under the pressure to do more and more to be holier and holier, I doubt that we'll be holier! Instead I believe God wants us to see our "everyday, ordinary lives" differently, colored with the beauty of God's presence in the faces of those we love and who are strangers and even enemies; in the intricacies and mysteries of birds, animals, and plants; in the activities of our daily lives" (31, 32).

May you ponder these words and your daily lives as being offerings to God...
