Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees meets on the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m., downtown.

In keeping with the Welcoming Statement, the Board of Trustees strives to strike a diverse balance on the

committee in terms of demographics, occupational backgrounds and life experience, so as to achieve a well-rounded approach in matters pertaining to FUMC. It is helpful to Trustees to have certain professionals on our

committee, but anyone with an interest in our physical church surroundings is welcome. We encourage the following people to consider our committee: Architects, Landscape Architects, Engineers, Interior Designers, Contractors or people in the building trades, Lawyers, Financial people, Insurance people, Real Estate.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Supervise, oversee and care for church property and equipment
- Review annually the property, liability, crime and personnel insurance of the church
- Do an annual review of the parsonages
- Receive and administer all bequests that are made to the congregation. (Endowment Committee and Insurance Committee are subcommittees of Trustees.)
- Submit annual budget requests to the committee on finance for property maintenance and improvement as well as new purchases, sale of property and capital campaigns
- Conduct an annual accessibility audit of buildings, grounds, and facilities

Desirable Characteristics:
